


NATIONAL PEST PLANT ACCORD

DON'T BUY OR SELL THESE PLANTS

They are pests and damaging to the New Zealand environment. They are banned from sale, propagation and distribution.







* There are several cultivars of *Tradescantia* including 'Pink Princess' and 'Golden Girl' (both are pictured). All are banned from sale, propagation and distribution.

** *Polygala myrtifolia* 'Grandiflora' is a cultivar and it is excluded from the NPPA.

*** *Zantedeschia aethiopica* 'Green Goddess' is a specific cultivar that is listed on the NPPA. Other forms of *Zantedeschia aethiopica* are not.

All plants listed on the National Pest Plant Accord are Unwanted Organisms under the Biosecurity Act 1993. Search online for MPI NPPA for more information and to see the full list of plants. Regional councils also declare some plants as pests in their Regional Pest Management Plans. These plants are regionally banned from sale, distribution and propagation. Visit your council's website to find out which plants are declared pests in your region.
